From Fr. Nolan

The Most Holy Rosary has received the highest praise and recommendation from the saints, ever since it was given to St. Dominic in the 12th century by Our Lady herself. She told St. Dominic that it would be a powerful means of conversion, saying "Wonder not that until now you have obtained so little fruit by your labors; you have spent them on a barren soil, not yet watered with the dew of divine grace. When God willed to renew the face of the earth, he began by sending down on it the fertilizing rain of the Angelic Salutation. Therefore, preach my Psalter."

Pope St. Pius V, in speaking of this marvelous vision of St. Dominic, said the following: "The Albigensian heresy, then raging in a part of France, had blinded so many of the laity... Blessed Dominic lifted his eyes to heaven and turned them toward the Virgin Mary, the Mother of God. Dominic received this method of

prayer, which is easy and suitable to everyone and which is called the Rosary, or the Psalter of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It consists of venerating the Blessed Virgin by reciting 150 Angelic Salutations, the same number as the Psalms of David, punctuating them at each decade by the Lord's Prayer, meanwhile meditating on the mysteries which recall the entire life of Our Lord Jesus Christ. After having devised it, Dominic and his sons spread this form of prayer throughout the Church."

This same holy Pontiff also praised the Rosary in the following words: "This devotion of the Rosary, which reverently honors both the principal mysteries of Christ and her alone who has crushed every heresy of the 13th century, and later on, often defeated the enemies of the Church. Rightly therefore, we must hope that the same power of the Rosary will repulse the horrors of hell, will annihilate the machinations of the godless, will remove from the people the errors that have been propagated and, with it, the great upheaval that convulses all mankind."

St. Alphonsus Liguori, that great Doctor of Moral Theology in the Church, says thus of the Rosary: "The immense good that this noble devotion has done to the world is well known. How many, by its means, have been delivered from sin! How many led to a holy life! How many to a good death and are now saved!"

Pope Leo XIII, called "The Rosary Pope", praises it in the following words: The Rosary is the most excellent form of prayer and the most efficacious means of attaining eternal life. It is the remedy for all our evils, the root of all our blessings. There is no more excellent way of praying."

St. Louis de Montfort, one of the foremost champions of the Rosary after St. Dominic himself, had this to say of the power of the Rosary in achieving the salvation of the Faithful: "If you say the Rosary faithfully until death, I assure you that, in spite of the gravity of your sins you shall receive a never fading crown of glory. Even if you are on the brink of damnation... even if you are a heretic as obstinate as the devil, sooner or later you will be converted and will amend your life and spare your soul, if – mark well what I say – if you say the Holy Rosary devoutly every day until death for the purpose of knowing the Truth and obtaining contrition and pardon for your sins"

Let us be convinced then, by the testimony of so many and such great witnesses of the Church, of the power and importance of this most holy devotion. Let us resolve to say it devoutly every day, for the good of the Church and the world, the conversion of sinners, for the poor souls in purgatory, and for our own salvation and those of our friends and family. +

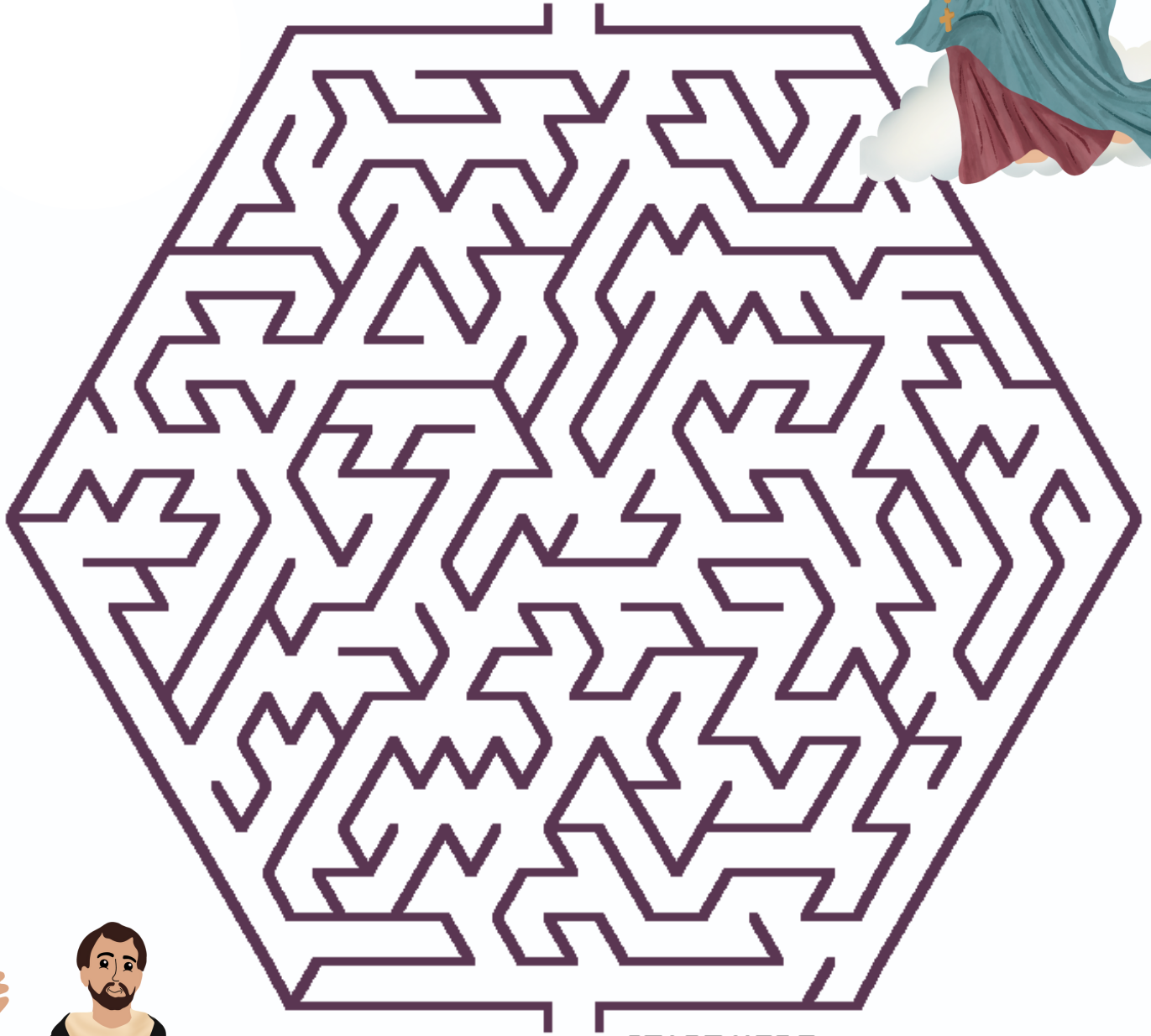
