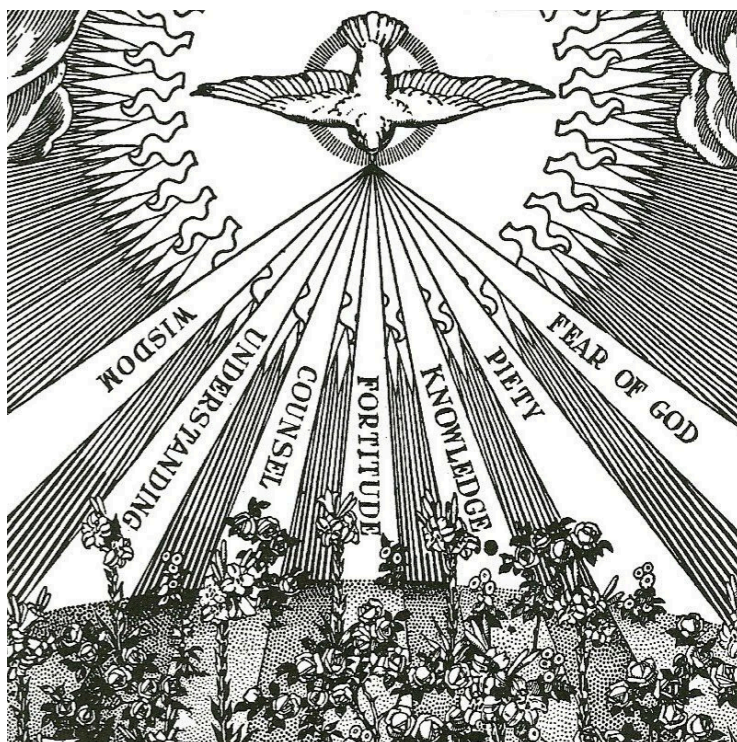

On Pastoral Solicitude (Fr Jerry Pokorsky, *Catholic World Report*)

has zero magisterial value... The trademark ambiguity is unmistakable, and its pronounced heterodox implications require a pastor's commentary to protect the integrity of his confessional... The Church is our mother and welcomes us all to conversion and worship. But unrepentant manifest grave sinners should not present themselves for Communion or be approved as sponsors for the Sacraments... As the saying goes, we judge the sin, but not the sinner. But if there is sufficient evidence of a sinful lifestyle, we must judge evil behavior. No thoughtful Christian turns his back on sinners. We must acknowledge common-sense reality and fundamental moral truths. We also pay attention to the correct meaning of words... A good confessor must not allow these errors to compromise his duties in the confessional... Those who depart from the Ten Commandments and suggest changes in Church teaching are guilty of grave error... Let's not call into question the authentic doctrines of the Church or deny the reality of human sexuality. These apparently private opinions of Francis, published as an autobiography... have no doctrinal authority. Because of his history of causing doctrinal confusion, we must carefully compare the Pope's utterances to the traditional teaching of the Catholic Church. When not in accord with that teaching, we must reject or ignore them.

Good News about Clarifications (Robert Greving, *Crisis Magazine*)

It does, as [Fernández and Francis] hoped it would, provide clarity; it just isn't the clarity they wanted. It doesn't clarify [previous magisterium] - you don't need to clarify "No." But it has clarified what many cardinals, bishops, and priests believe about [Church doctrine] and even about the Church herself. Both sides of the fence agree about what it says... Cardinal Müller or Fr. Martin... the bishops in Germany or in Africa... see the document as granting some form of Church approval of those living in "irregular situations," [previously] called sinful. It has become [a] test of the Catholic Faith... We shall now know where each priest stands on this and, by extension, many other issues. For that reason, *Fiducia Supplicans* is problematic for those trying to keep this papacy in continuity with the previous two (or two hundred). As with *Amoris Laetitia* (and other papal pronouncements), there seems a clear break in what the Church has previously taught. The subsequent clarification has only clarified the rupture... I see *Fiducia Supplicans* as a sort of *Obergefell v. Hodges* in the Church. There really was no need to allow homosexual couples to have the same legal status as a married couple. Any discrepancy in property or monetary distribution could have been easily remedied by slight changes in statutes and no one would have cared. The real purpose of *Obergefell* was to force others to call something what those others believe it is not. *Fiducia Supplicans* now makes this not a question of civil law but of Faith. And in matters of Faith, there is nowhere to hide... This latest dictate will clarify matters for the next conclave. Those gathering there will be judging papabile in all of the above aspects... The final question on the exam in the minds of many, if not most, of the electors about a possible successor may be "What was his response to *Fiducia Supplicans*?" After ten years, we now have a situation in which a man can leave his wife and enter a homosexual relationship and not only legitimately still receive Communion but have that homosexual relationship blessed. Do they want more of this?
