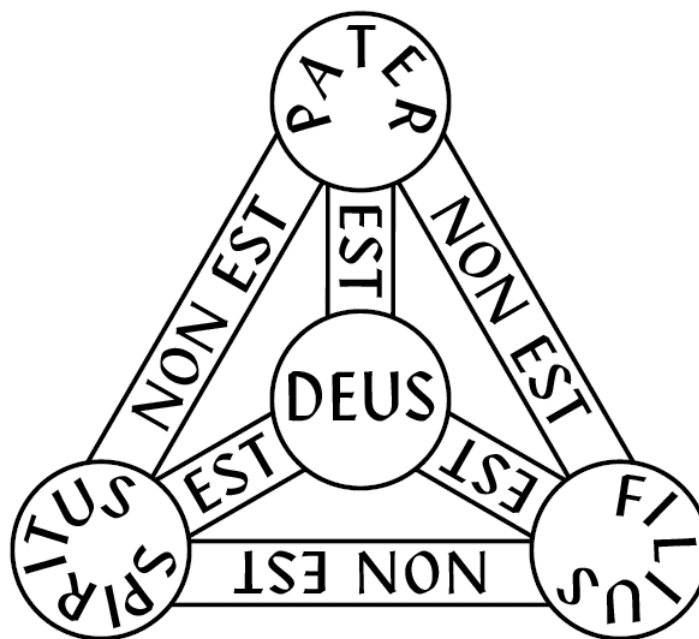

The Imitation of Christ by Thomas a' Kempis
CHAPTER I - Imitation Of Christ And Contempt Of The World

"No follower of mine shall ever walk in darkness" (John 8:12). These words of Our Lord counsel all to walk in His footsteps. If you seek true illumination and deliverance from blindness of heart, it is His virtues you must imitate. Let it be your most earnest study to dwell upon the life of Jesus Christ.

Christ's teaching surpasses the teaching of all the saints; but to find this spiritual nourishment you must seek to have the spirit of Christ. It is because we lack this spirit that so often we listen to the Gospel without really hearing it.

Those who would fully understand Christ's words, must labor to conform their lives to His.

To be learned and able to discuss the Trinity will get you nowhere if you do not have humility, and therefore displease the Trinity.

Lofty words neither save you nor make you a saint; only a virtuous life makes you dear to God. It is better to experience contrition than be able to define it.

If you knew the whole Bible, and all the sayings of the philosophers, what would this profit you without the love and grace of God?

How foolish it is to seek, and to trust in riches that shall pass. How foolish to desire honors, and a high place above others.

How foolish to wish for a long life, but not care whether it is a good one; to be concerned only with the present, with never a thought of eternity and the endless joy that awaits you.

How foolish to follow the impulses of the flesh, or to covet those things which so soon will cost you a heavy penalty. They who follow after their carnal desires defile the conscience and destroy the grace of God.

Often think of the proverb "*The eye is not satisfied with seeing, nor the ear with hearing*" (Eccl 1:8). Be determined to detach your heart from the love of visible things, allowing it to center on those which are unseen.

Nothing matters except to love God and serve Him The height of wisdom is to set your goal on heaven, and to cast this world behind.

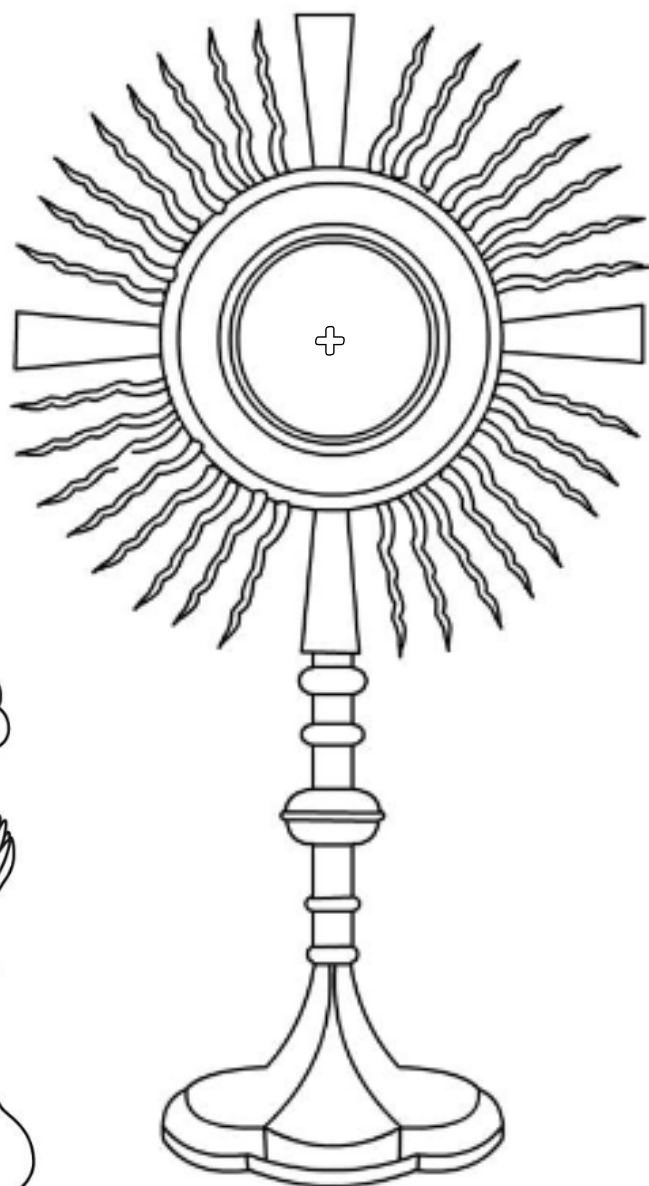
