

Redde quod debes!

From Fr. Krager

The Screwtape Letters by C. S. Lewis is a fictional series of correspondence from Screwtape, a senior devil, to his inexperienced nephew Wormwood. The junior devil is assigned to work with a man named only "the patient," who has recently converted to Christianity. Whereas Wormwood wants to propose extravagant sins to his charge, Screwtape patiently explains that "the father below" finds much more success when his agents use other, more subtle means. The book ends

with "the patient" being killed in action during the Blitz of World War II.

Although it is written in a satirical and humorous way and it is most certainly fictional, the Screwtape Letters is a masterpiece. It is a sort of spiritual direction in reverse, revealing to Christians common pitfalls and traps set for us by our enemy. The senior tempter has an ingenious commentary on the weakness of human nature, the strength of virtue and grace, and the dichotomy of the workings of God and the workings of the devil. The book is also a useful remedy for those who can be dazzled by the Hollywood-ified version of the demonic, which tries to make it seem as if the real mission of Hell is to spin heads and haunt nightmares, but not to sever our friendship with God.

Below are some extracts from the book:

"It does not matter how small the sins are provided that their cumulative effect is to edge the man away from the Light and out into the Nothing. Murder is no better than cards if cards can do the trick. Indeed the safest road to Hell is the gradual one--the gentle slope, soft underfoot, without sudden turnings, without milestones, without signposts."

"It is, no doubt, impossible to prevent his praying for his mother, but we have means of rendering the prayers innocuous. Make sure that they are always very "spiritual," that he is always concerned with the state of her soul and never with her rheumatism... Since his ideas about her soul will be very crude and often erroneous, he will, in some degree, be praying for an imaginary person, and it will be your task to make that imaginary person daily less and less like the real mother - the sharp-tongued old lady at the breakfast table. In time, you may get the cleavage so wide that no thought or feeling from his prayers for the imagined mother will ever flow over into his treatment of the real one. I have had patients of my own so well in hand that they could be turned at a moment's notice from impassioned prayer for a wife's or son's "soul" to beating or insulting the real wife or son without a qualm."

"Be not deceived, Wormwood, our cause is never more in jeopardy than when a human, no longer desiring but still intending to do our Enemy's [i.e. God's] will, looks round upon a universe in which every trace of Him seems to have vanished, and asks why he has been forsaken, and still obeys."

"[God] sees as well as you do that courage is not simply one of the virtues, but the form of every virtue at the testing point, which means, at the point of highest reality. A chastity or honesty, or mercy, which yields to danger will be chaste or honest or merciful only on conditions. Pilate was merciful till it became risky."

"When they have really learned to love their neighbors as themselves, they will be allowed to love themselves as their neighbors."

"A moderated religion is as good for us as no religion at all—and more amusing."

"Whatever their bodies do affects their souls. It is funny how mortals always picture us [demons] as putting things into their minds: in reality our best work is done by keeping things out..."
