The Bishops' Budget (Michael Hitchborn, Lifesite News)

63 million. It's a number so large the human mind can scarcely comprehend what it means. If we were to stack 63 million \$1 bills, the stack would be about 2,718 feet high, which is just one foot higher than the tallest building in the world - the Burj Khalifa in Dubai. 63 million miles is the distance from Earth to Mars during its closest approach. Out of 197 countries in the world, 174 have populations of less than 63

million. And yet, since 1973, the United States alone has murdered 63 million people through decriminalized abortion. Joseph Stalin, the tyrannical, murderous dictator of Communist Russia, is oft remembered for having said, "The death of one man is a tragedy, the death of millions is a statistic," but despite the number on a ledger sheet or the various ways in which one attempts to comprehend the deaths of millions, one thing remains: every single one of those millions is a unique, unrepeatable, and immortal soul. Every. Single. One. To wrap one's mind around the murder of 63 million babies, all that is needed is to assume the point of view of each one. Each of those babies was once in a warm, safe, and nurturing environment, and then each was either killed with chemicals or systematically pulled apart. But here's another way of looking at the number 63 million - it's about 27 times more in dollars than the budget of the pro-life office of the USCCB. Here's what I mean - the pro-life activities office of the USCCB had a budget of approximately \$2.3 million in 2017. To put that into perspective, the USCCB's office of migration and refugee services had a budget that same year of \$82 million; \$76.4 million of which came from the federal government.

The Bishops Bite Back (John Lavenburg, Crux Magazine)

Citing the violation of multiple laws and Congress's authority to control government spending as outlined by the Constitution, the USCCB has sued the Trump administration over its halt of refugee resettlement funding.

Septuagesima (Fr. Richard Cipolla, Rorate Caeli)

The gospel for Septuagesima: the parable of the owner of the vineyard and those who worked in the vineyard. The owner hires workers from early in the morning until late in the afternoon. When the time to give each his wages, the owner gives the same wage to all of the workers. Those who started at seven in the morning got the same wage as those who began work at noon and the same wage as those who worked for an hour before dusk. Those who had worked the whole day complain bitterly to the owner about this situation that they see as very unfair. The owner says: "I am not being unfair to you, friend. Didn't you agree to work for a denarius? Take your pay and go. I want to give the one who was hired last the same as I gave you. Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?"' Then Jesus' words: "So the last shall be first and the first shall be last." ... This gospel ... is a slap in the face, for the purpose of not treating Lent as if it is another Church season that can be gotten through by giving up candy and making a few donations to charities and going to Confession.

Septuagesima (Fr John Zuhlsdorf, OnePeterFive)

It is Septuagesima... <u>Start thinking about Lent now, not on the morning of Ash Wednesday.</u>

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Current Canon Law on Abstinence, Penance and Fasting:

Days of Abstinence:

- Begins on one's 14th birthday
- Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent
- Obliges abstention from flesh meat

Days of Penance:

- Applies to all the Faithful
- Lent and Fridays outside of Lent
- Obligation is lifted on days celebrated as Solemnities

Days of Fast:

- Applies to everyone aged 18 to 59, inclusive
- One full meal permitted and two other meals may be taken which, when combined, are less than a full meal
- · Ash Wednesday and Good Friday

Wed, Mar 5 - Ash Wednesday: Masses will be at 8:30am, 12pm and 7pm High Mass. Ashes will be distributed promptly at the start of Mass.

Ash Wednesday is a day of Fast and Abstinence by law, not pious custom.

All Fridays in Lent are days of Abstinence by law, not pious custom.


