

Although the 11th Sunday after Pentecost takes precedence over the Feast of St. Bartholomew this year, nonetheless, August 24th remains the day we remember this great Apostle. There is not much reference to him in the Scriptures, though it has long been held that he is the same person as Nathaniel. Thus, what we do know about him from the Scriptures is that when Philip told him the Messiah had come and was a Nazarene, Nathaniel was skeptical: "Can anything good come from Nazareth?" (Jn 1:46).

We may be tempted to think that this was a slight toward the town of Nazareth and its inhabitants. We may also be tempted to think Bartholomew was a mere cynic, a doubter like his fellow Apostle Thomas, perhaps a skeptic in the vein of Zechariah. But these temptations can be put to rest when we hear the unique compliment our Lord pays to Bartholomew: "Behold an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no guile" (Jn 1:47).

Our Blessed Lord recognizes in Bartholomew a true Israelite and therefore one that knows the Scriptures—including the prophecies that stated the Messiah was to come from Bethlehem (see Micah 5:2). Bartholomew is not concerned with the goodness of the town or people of Nazareth. Instead, his question regards the Messiah as the Good who will come as a fulfilment of God's promise. If the Messiah was to come from Bethlehem in the line of David, how is it that he is a Nazarene? Thus, Bartholomew's deference to the veracity of the Scriptures is seen as prudent, evidence of a true follower of God, and so moves our Lord to pay him a high compliment.

In his commentary on this passage from John's Gospel, St. Augustine addresses the second portion of our Lord's compliment:

"What means this, in whom is no guile? Had he no sin? Was no physician necessary for him? Far from it. No one was ever born of a temper not to need the Physician. It is guile, when we say one thing, and think another."

St. Augustine is clear that our Lord was not proclaiming Bartholomew to be one who was free of sin and therefore not in need of a Savior. Instead, he was one who recognized his sinfulness, his need for the Messiah whom he hoped would be the Savior. This is why our Lord tells Bartholomew that He saw him sitting beneath the fig tree (Jn 1:48)—fig leaves having long been a symbol of sin. The Lord saw Bartholomew while he was yet under the shadow of sin and death, saw Bartholomew's admission of this by sitting beneath the fig tree in repentance, and thus came to him as the One who could save. Bartholomew longed to be set free from sin but was not willing to simply smile and nod when his friend suggested he believe something that did not accord with the Scriptures. Instead, he spoke his mind honestly-no duplicity within him.

St. Bartholomew serves as a great reminder to us that what we think in our minds, believe in our hearts, and speak with our words, must all be one and the same—no guile within us. Further, what we keep in our mind, on our lips, and in our hearts need always be directed toward God. In this way, hiding nothing from God will allow Him to see us in our sinfulness, so that our Divine Physician can bring healing where it is needed, removing from us that which keeps us in the shade of death and bringing us into He who is Light, as is revealed in the Scriptures
