

From the Press

On 100 Days of Pope Leo XIV (Rorate Caeli)

Change is happening, but not in the sense of an unrealistic reversal (which in itself is not the Church's method, as already pointed out by far more authoritative observers), but rather in the sense of normalization. This is also expressed through symbols. Since the habit makes the monk (and also the rejection of it), it is inevitable to note that even in outward appearances, Leo XIV has chosen not to be "capricious": the clothes of Peter come before the person and tastes of the Pope. Thus, the return of that red mozzetta that seemed to have been consigned to the attic meant much more than a matter of tailoring: it indicates that the elected pope is not the 'super-pope' who must strive to appear kinder or more humble than his predecessors.

And the return to Castel Gandolfo indicates that he is not a workaholic who disdains a bit of healthy vacationing in the name of a "weekday" conception of the papacy. On the contrary, he is one of the links in a chain that goes back to Peter and transcends the individual personality who holds the keys in this or that specific historical conjuncture. And Leo XIV, in particular, shows that he is not the type to impulsively discard what he likes least, much less to pose as the "refounder" of the Holy Roman Church. Whereas on March 13, 2013, the symbols (and their rejection) spoke of a break with the recent past, since May 8, a language of mending and reconciliation seems to prevail.

Finally, the involuntary diagnosis of the faithful (and the less faithful) should not be overlooked. There is a certain sense of relief among those who wanted the Vicar of Christ, whoever was elected, to speak about Christ. And for the same reason, there is a certain disappointment among those who were looking for a media personality to be "measured" on the basis of real or presumed or trumpeted openness: if they don't like him, it is certainly a good sign.

Some More on the Same (Rorate Caeli)

As Pope Leo XIV is approaching the 100-day mark of his pontificate, more and more decisions are coming out which appear indicative of the course of his papacy. Our new Pope is starting to address difficult dilemmas... So far, Pope Leo appears to have alternated between either ensuring a return to orthodoxy behind the scenes, or punting on liberal reforms, not killing them, but leaving their conclusion uncertain. Key curial appointments by Pope Leo will give a more definitive indication of what shape his pontificate will take. Positive patterns do already seem to be slowly emerging, however.

And Some More (Rorate Caeli)

It is also true, however, that in no area has the Pontiff crossed the line set by his predecessor. On the contrary, there have been signs of a reversal: "Marriage is not an ideal but the measure of true love between a man and a woman", he said... correcting Amoris laetitia; in his speech to government leaders... along the lines of Benedict XVI, Pope Leo firmly defended natural law, "written not by human hands, but acknowledged as valid in all times and places"; in a homily at Castel Gandolfo he seemed to correct the green ideology so prized by Francis; he affirmed that Judas Iscariot chose to exclude himself from salvation with his betrayal, in contrast with Pope Bergoglio, who had said he did not know whether Judas had gone to hell. In a letter addressed to the ecclesial conference of the Amazon he condemned the worship of nature, putting Christ and the Eucharist at the centre of evangelisation... Meanwhile the Pope appointed Cardinal Robert Sarah as his special envoy for the solemn celebrations held at the shrine of Sainte-Anne-d'Auray [on] the four hundredth anniversary of the apparitions, and Cardinal Dominik Daka, who signed the dubia on Amoris Laetitiae, as his special envoy to the celebrations for the centenary of the establishment of the Archdiocese of Gdańsk (Poland). Then Leo XIV received in private audience Cardinal Raymond Leo Burke, whom Francis considered one of his worst enemies.
